

Bridget Ozanne Orchid Fields - 2022

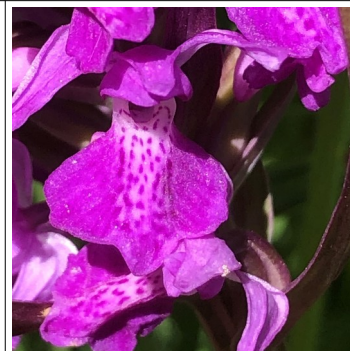
Please take care – the paths are rough and uneven, the vegetation often tall and wet

Note – some orchids will hybridize between species, so can be very variable in form



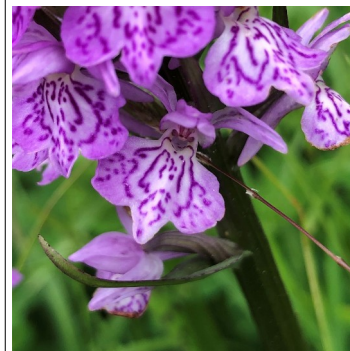
Loose-flowered Orchid (*Anacamptis laxiflora*) – unspotted leaves, distinctive open flower-head

Yellow Bartsia
(*Parentucellia viscosa*)



Southern Marsh-orchid (*Dactylorhiza praetermissa*) – unspotted leaves, lower petal markings mostly central

Yellow Iris
(*Iris pseudacorus*)



Common Spotted-orchid (*Dactylorhiza fuchsii*) – lower petal markings usually dashes and lines. The middle lobe is usually longer than the two side lobes

Lesser Spearwort
(*Ranunculus flammula*)



Heath Spotted-orchid (*Dactylorhiza maculata*) – lower petal markings usually dots. The middle lobe is usually narrower and shorter than the two side lobes

Ragged Robin
(*Lychnis flos-cuculi*)
